This week we have started our new story of the 3 Little Pigs. We have been telling the story to each other and putting actions to the story. The children have enjoyed building houses out of straw, bricks and sticks. The children have particularly enjoyed making bread into pigs and making their own pigs out of clay. In maths this week we have been learning about shapes, we have described them and written about them, we have also used shapes to make houses and pigs.
