As we enter the Spring Term, it is lovely to see the children growing in confidence, becoming more independent and joining in play in groups. Reception with Miss Barby

As the weather is beginning to turn wintry, we have been learning about the Arctic and Antarctic, including looking at the animals that live there. We even had a go at building our own marshmallow igloos! We have had a focus on different art activities this half term and have made lots of 'winter' creations. The children have also really enjoyed investigating ice and different ways to melt the ice.

We have also been looking at the Chinese story of the Magic Paintbrush and have painted pictures with our own 'magic' paintbrushes, writing labels and captions to go with them. Next week, we will be learning about Chinese New Year, cooking Chinese noodles and also eating prawn crackers and fortune cookies. So far, in the cooking sessions, the children have enjoyed making pizzas from Italy, kebabs from Greece and haggis, neeps and tatties from Scotland.

In Maths, we have been continuing to explore numbers, practising our counting forwards and backwards and have learnt about 2d shapes and 3D shapes and their properties. We will be moving back onto simple addition over the coming weeks.
