This week the children have had a wonderful time reading the story of Supertato. This week, we have continued to learn about simple 2D shapes, looking at the appearance and number of their sides and describing them using words like, 'round' and 'straight'. Some of the Children Came on a shape hunt around the Classroom, finding objects that were Circular, triangular, rectangular or square in shape and recording how many they had seen on our tally Chart. We have also been looking at numbers to 5 and beyond in different ways; rolling Cars down ramps to see which number they landed on and counting how many of our shoes could fit into a T-Rex's footprint. In Phonics, we tried to find the odd one out in a set of rhyming words and sorted objects according to whether they began with 's' or 'a'. Other popular activities this week have been mixing magic potions, making salt-dough decorations and painting dinosaurs in various shades of pink!
