This week we will be:

- Learning about the different ways on how to attack and defend a castle
- Writing these in factual pieces of writing
- Having a class castle battle and putting some of these ideas into practise
- Looking at the features of a factual report and writing our own from the class castle battle
- Adding by counting on, using number lines for Year 1 and learning the column method for Year 2
- Sorting and explaining the uses of different materials in science
- Developing our coordination and movement skills in PE
- Performing different balances for gymnastics
- Starting to learn our songs for the KS1 Christmas production
