The children have had a very busy week and they all looked fantastic in their costumes on Roald Dahl dress up day. We have started the week by counting up to 20 and using 'Muddles' the puppet to help us to recognise numbers. We have been focussing on listening skills this week, following the instructions in action songs, describing the sounds that we hear and listening very Carefully to distinguish between sounds made by different shakers. The children have loved using the Cd player to Choose their own songs to dance to and following the beat on the musical instruments. We have also explored paint, using sponges, toothbrushes and stickle-bricks, amongst other things, to make marks and made our very own, very sticky version of play-dough!
