Safeguarding

We take safeguarding very seriously at Overstone; if you have any concerns regarding a child in the school please speak to Mrs France, who is our Safeguarding Officer or Mrs Sim, who is our Deputy Safeguarding Officer. Mrs Michelle Sutton, our Chair of Governors is our Safeguarding Governor. Our website has lots of information for parents and children with regard to Safeguarding, including information on how to help your child understand how to stay safe online. At the beginning of the term, all of the children in the Infant School took part in the NSPCC Pantosaurus lessons about appropriate and inappropriate behaviour and acceptable boundaries. In the next few weeks we will be participating in an assembly with a speaker from the NSPCC as part of their 'Stay Safe, Speak Out' initiative.

Alongside this newsletter we have attached the NSPCC documents for Parents linked to the Pantosaurus lessons; this will give you an opportunity to be aware of the themes discussed at school with your child and allow you to discuss inappropriate behaviour and boundaries. We have also attached the posters that your child will be familiar with from the lessons in school. On the NSPCC site there are some excellent resources linked to this topic and the Pantosaurus song and video for your children to watch along with a short quiz for your child to complete with you at home. (We have completed this at school but it would be good for the children to complete this with a parent also).
