#### This week we will be:

- Reading 'Amazing Animal Journeys' by Chris Packham.
- Learning about animal migration in Literacy and Science.

#### Homework

#### Tovs

Please discourage your child from bringing in toys, to avoid disappointment or items going missing. We do not do 'Show and Tell' in KS1 for anything unrelated to our current work.

#### Reading

It has been great to see so many children bringing in their own books from home to read in school. We want to promote this culture of reading in school as much as possible. However, we recommend bringing in only one book for independent reading, if you are happy for them to do so and we will discourage children from taking them outside for break, as we don't want them getting dropped in a puddle! Children will still have access to the reading scheme in school. They are encouraged to read these books every night, to help in their progression and they can change them independently in the mornings.

World Book Day will be celebrated this week on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> March. Your child can dress up as their favourite book character, if they would like to (but please consider thermals underneath their costume and warm jumpers/coats on top).
