Your child is expected to come to school wearing school uniform. V-neck sweatshirts, polo shirts and various items of PE clothing can be purchased online (see the link on our website) or from the 'Wear2School' uniform shop on North Street, Leighton Buzzard.

Children in the Nursery wear a practical and simple uniform, consisting of:

A navy or white t-shirt

A navy sweatshirt

Navy jogging bottoms (shorts in the summer)

Grey or white socks

Plimsolls for indoors

Wellingtons for outdoors

Please note that trainers or open-toed sandals are not permitted for safety reasons.

We will provide a tabard for the younger children to wear each day.

Children in the Reception class should wear a navy blue polo shirt, to avoid difficulties with ties and shirts. Otherwise all items of uniform are as listed below.
