PE and Forest School lessons

Forest School sessions will commence from Monday 12th September for children in classes from <u>YR up to Y2</u>. Mrs May reminds you that an under-layer (with long sleeves so as to avoid stings), wellies and waterproofs are essential. On Forest school days the children should come to school in normal uniform and could use an over-sized bag (such as a 'Bag for Life' or 'Ikea' type) which would be big enough for everything that they have to carry for Forest School.

Snacks

Children in KS1 are given fruit at school each morning. KS2 children can bring a piece of fruit / dried fruit or healthy granary bar to eat during morning break should they wish. No sugary snacks or anything containing chocolate are permitted.

All children should still be bringing a bottle of water to school with them. These must have a sports top. Hydration throughout the day is important to aid concentration.

Please DO NOT send your child into school with nuts or food containing nuts.

Parentmail

Please be patient while the system is updated at the start of term. We had new computers installed over the summer and this has caused issues with Parentmail. Therefore, *if you are not receiving the newsletters electronically to your chosen e-mail address in a week's time, please drop a note to the school office.*

In the meantime, do collect a hard copy of anything you have missed so far, or have a look on the school website.

Data Collection & Consent Sheets

During the month of September, we will be sending home your child's data collection sheet, which we would ask you to carefully check and return as soon as possible, so that our records can be updated accordingly.

Letters

Please put letters, reply slips, payments etc. in the post box outside the front entrance. Anything with money or cheques must be in a sealed envelope, <u>indicating who or what it is for</u>. Single forms need not be in an envelope. When possible, please do not put mixed letters/forms in the one envelope, to help prevent items going astray.

Punctuality

We would like to remind everyone that the dining room door is locked at 8.45am each morning. Any children arriving after this time must report to the office before heading to their classroom. Late arrivals disrupt the start of the school day for the child and the rest of the class. Absences and late arrivals are being monitored.

School Milk



Schools in England are legally required to ensure milk is made available during the school day to all pupils. Currently children in Nursery and Reception classes have the opportunity to have a drink of milk every day. Their milk is free up to their 5th birthday

and school pay for the remainder until they leave Reception Class. The milk provided is semi-skimmed. For children in Y1 - Y6 to have milk in school, you can register and pay for milk via: www.coolmilk.com

If your child is currently eligible for benefits related Free School Meals (not the Universal Free School Meals for KS1) there will

be no charge to you but instead of applying online, you will need to contact the school in writing, so that we can arrange it for you.
