With the Chilly weather setting in, this week we made dens outside in which to hibernate. We were also inspired by our nature walk last week to Create Autumn pictures, using a variety of materials. In Phonics, we have been enjoying rhyming songs and books and listening Carefully during 'Simon Says'. In Maths, we investigated the relative sizes of animals, describing them as taller and shorter. We were surprised by how tall a giraffe can be! This led to lots of measuring objects and people around Nursery, to see what was taller or shorter than a metre stick. Later, the Children decided that Christmas had come to our Home Corner already and the metre sticks ended up as a makeshift Christmas tree. We wrapped lots of presents, decorated the tree and sang some festive songs!
