# With Miss Smith and Mr Bradman

This week we have been reading the story of Cinderella, we have been making shields, sequencing the story, made clothes for a Princess or Prince, measured our feet for the glass slipper and made a pocket watch. In literacy we have been changing the story of The Three Little Pigs to write our own versions of the story. We have also been making some lovely crafts for Mothers' Day and have been investigating shadows.

### Next week

We will be reading the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff and looking at the Easter story. Next week (after Muffins with Mum on Friday 24th) we are also inviting someone special to each child to come in to the Early Years setting to spend the morning with the children making crafts and taking part in activities. The morning will be to celebrate Mothers' Day and the classroom will be open from 9:00-10:00am. On Friday the children are also allowed to come into school wearing their pyjamas for Red Nose Day. The cost of this is £1.

### <u>Behaviour</u>

At Overstone we use positive praise and rewards to encourage appropriate behaviour. However, there have been a few incidents on the playground recently of rough play and fighting. We have discussed with the children the importance of safe and appropriate play and they have been made aware that they will be missing some of their playtime, if they are unable to play appropriately.

We have been doing lots of counting this week, singing 5 Green Bottles, thinking about how many bottles would be left when each one fell and identifying and writing the Correct numbers. In Phonics, we have been robot-talking (segmenting) simple words and trying to put them back together again.
