Important Covid -19 FAQs for the holiday period.

Do I have to let school know if my child tests positive in the holidays?

Yes, If your child displays symptoms and has a test up until the 24th December **and the test result is positive** please contact us immediately by using the <u>admin@overstone-wing.org</u> email as we will have to inform anyone who had close contact with your child within 48 hours of the positive test and isolate your child's bubble. We will be monitoring the email but we will not be in school to take telephone calls. Our priority is to keep everyone safe and informed about what we all need to do to prevent the spread of Covid amongst our community.

# How will I be informed of a positive case in my child's bubble during the holidays?

You will receive an email from us if your child needs to isolate over the holiday. This will only happen if someone tests positive within 48 hours of being in school.

Do I need to let school know if we are isolating due to NHS Test and Trace during the holidays?

Yes please let us know if this isolation will run over the return date of 4th January.

#### Do I need to send my child to school in January if I we have a close family member who is vulnerable or who we wish to shield?

Yes, the guidance from government says that all children should be in school. If you do not send your child in this will go on record as an unauthorised absence unless they themselves are isolating, ill or have been advised by a doctor that they are vulnerable and should stay at home.


