News from our classes

We have learnt so much more through having her come in and talk to us and were very grateful to her for taking time out of her busy day.

We have been looking at healthy eating and at Mediterranean foods so we used some Mediterranean ingredients in our pasta sauce and have tasted olives, feta cheese and other delicious toppings on our 'bruschetta'.

Our award was based on our school values: listening; kindness; respect and trying our hardest. In geography, we became 'food tourists' in Switzerland. The children sampled various types of Swiss cheese and meats - everyone had such fun!
